## **Speedwatch – Peter Watson**

- Many bins now have stickers. These are being applied, by me on a Tuesday or Thursday morning, whenever my time allows. They should all be finished, on all three types of bins, by Christmas,

## Village Hall Sewerage Plant – Peter Watson

- the system would require sealed tank(s) to be installed, which would be gulped when necessary,
- the committee agreed to me staying as project manager for the duration of the project, but not as part of the committee,
- Liz has agreed to approach Binders to attempt a better quote,
- I have approached Binders for a formal written quote to enable the grant process to begin,
- I am looking at two forms of external funding, i.e. outside of contributions from RPC and RVHMC, namely CIL and Viridor Credit Environmental grants. We do fall within the radius of their facilities and, as such, eligible for grant application,
- no updates from SCC as to their proposals,
- any installation will require approval from Hitchcock Farms, as Landlord.
